Course Purpose and Objectives	This course aims to introduce students to the European legal system and teach them the principles of law relating to the Hospitality Industry. Students will learn the different sources of law, how companies are formed and the legal formalities on how to form and deal with a contract. Students will also learn the different legislations which aim in protecting the consumer rights.

Analyze the reasons for the termination of an employment contract and the different remedies available. 5. Analyse the basic principles of offer, acceptance and consideration.
