Course Title	BUSINESS AND CORPORATE LAW II
Course Code	LAW 310
Course Purpose and Objectives	The purpose of this course is to provide students an in-depth knowledge of corporate and business law concepts. It places special emphasis on the aspects of company law, including the administration and regulation of companies, partnership law, employment law and insolvency law. It also introduces students to the law of negligence and examines the area concerning the capital and financing of companies. It further provides an outline of the area of corporate fraudulent and criminal behaviour. Students will be able to explain and analyse how public and private limited companies are formed, managed, financed and regulated. Students will be taught the relevant regulations of employment relationships and business-related ethical issues.
Learning Outcomes	 Compare types of capital and the financing of companies. Describe and explain how companies are managed, administered and regulated. Compare and contrast the characteristics (i.e. structure, liability, management and formation) between various types of entities (e.g. companies and partnerships) Analyse the role of directors and their duties towards the company. Explain the types of company meetings and resolutions. Explain the legal implications relating to insolvency law. Critically evaluate the term 'Intellectual Property (IP)'. Recognize various forms of IP like trade, marks and patents. Analyze why IP adds value to the business. Outline the procedure on how to protect a piece of IP in Cyprus, Europe and globally. Examine the nature and control of corporate fraudulent and criminal behaviour concerning money laundering, bribery and fraudulent trading amongst others.
